**Did You Know?**

**ST. PATRICK (c. 389 - c. 461)** The son of a Romano-British official, Calpurnius, St. Patrick was born somewhere in Roman Britain. He was captured by raiders about age 16 and carried off in slavery to pagan Ireland. He escaped about 6 years later, returning to Britain about age 22 to study at the monastery of Lerins, 412-415. After he was ordained he was sent to Ireland. He founded the cathedral church of Armagh now known as St. Patrick’s Catholic Cathedral & converted the Irish to the faith they have so fiercely defended through the centuries.
