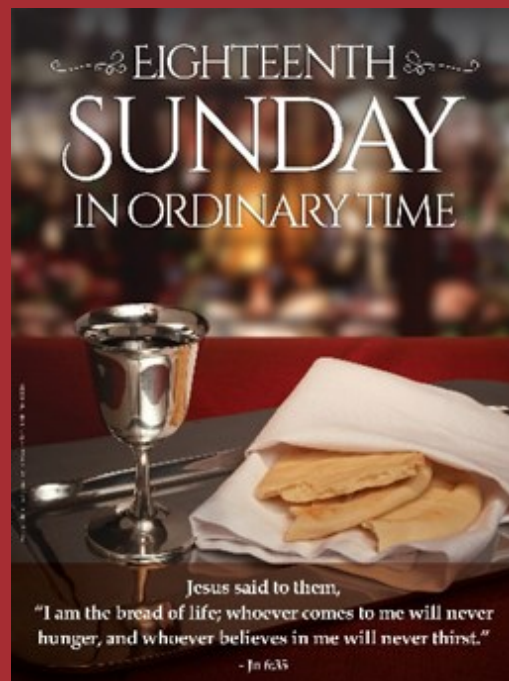

Pilgrimage to Walk in the Footsteps of Fr. Sebastian Rale

In visiting the places he preached and ministered, those gathered at a special pilgrimage in Madison on Saturday, **August 11**, will have the opportunity to experience a walk in the historic footsteps of Fr. Sebastian R  le (also spelled R  sle). All are welcome to attend. The group will meet at Notre Dame de Lourdes Church, located on 273 Water Street in Skowhegan, at 9 a.m. before driving to the site of the old mission at St. Sebastian Cemetery on Father R  sle Road in Madison. Father R  le lived much of his life among the Abenaki people and fiercely defended their rights. He was killed by the British in 1724. There will be several opportunities for prayer and meditation during the pilgrimage, and excerpts from letters written by or about Father R  le will be read along with Scripture passages. The pilgrimage will conclude around 1 p.m. at the memorial of Father R  le, located in St. Sebastian Cemetery on the spot where he was killed. Maine Catholic Men's Conference in Portland

The 7th annual Maine Catholic Men's Conference will be held at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Portland on Saturday, **October 13th**. Registration will begin at 7:30 a.m. with the conference running from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and concluding with a Mass celebrated by Bishop Robert P. Deeley. Presenters include Father Nathan March, pastor of Holy Savior Parish in Rumford; Deacon Harold BurkeSivers, a dynamic Catholic evangelist, radio host, and best-selling author; and Dr. William Martel, a member of Good Shepherd Parish in Saco who was a Protestant theologian before becoming a member of the Catholic Church. 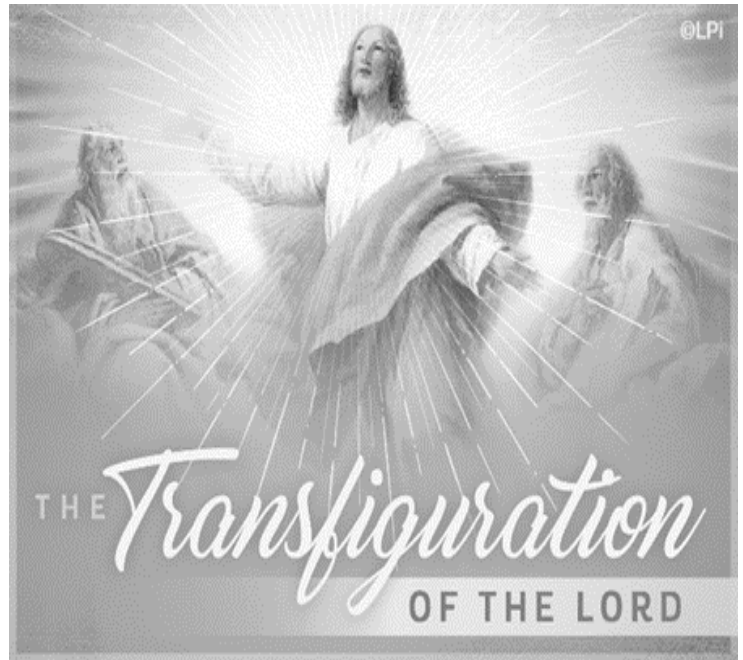
